

Program:

Marcia Dennis continued her seminar combining "new member orientation" with "old member reminders" about the Only Normal Rotary Club in the World. She introduced the new members, and then the current Officers and the Board of Directors.

Incoming President Sherry Hawkins spoke about her intention to focus on new community service projects. Public Relations Director Larissa McIlvain spoke about the Spoke, and described her committee's attention to Facebook updates, the Club website, and press releases to the District and the news media.

Angie Bubon, the Director of Foundation & International/Youth projects, said our club was at about 86% of our 2017/2018 goal of raising \$7000. She described three global grants (Kenya, Uganda and India) in progress. Giving opportunities were also described by Alan Chapman. He talked about Every Rotarian, Every Year, the sustaining membership of \$100/year, Paul Harris Fellows (those who have given \$1000 or more), and the Paul Harris Society (those who give \$1000 every year; we have 8 members in our Club at that level.)

Marcia concluded by describing how our \$50/month dues are allocated - \$32 goes for our lunches, \$5 to Rotary International, \$4 for District 6490 dues, and \$9 for Club expenses. She described our current 68 members as a "good number," but "we could always have more."
